Year 4 and 5 1:1 iPad Program

As we continue to provide the best learning opportunities for our students, the use of technology can often assist in this process. We want to develop students at our school who are life-long learners, who can effectively communicate, collaborate and solve problems and who are innovative, creative and responsible digital citizens. We are excited to introduce a 1:1 iPad program for our Year 4 and 5 students this year. The iPads will be distributed to students soon and the teachers are excited to begin integrating them into the daily classroom learning opportunities for the students. This opportunity does provide us with a timely reminder about the appropriate use of technology and staying safe when online. Our Acceptable Use of Technology Policy can be accessed through our website and a copy of this was also sent home with our Year 4-6 students on Tuesday. Teachers will continue to teach online cybersafety as part of their programs, but I do encourage parents to have conversations with their children about appropriate use of technology, setting limits on use and what their plan is should something inappropriate be accessed or sent to them. I truly believe clear communication, boundaries and an openness between parents and children is an important aspect of any form of parenting to create children who are resilient, responsible and empowered.
