Dear Parents and Caregivers,

Russell and I gathered with over 480 CEWA Principals and Assistant Principals from across the State on Monday 29 July at Perth Convention and Exhibition Centre to explore the Catholic Education Strategic Directions, as promulgated by the Catholic Education Commission of Western Australia (CECWA). We began with prayer that was led by Servite College students and a Welcome to Country with a Whadjuk Wardandi Noongar man.

We were led through a presentation by Lana Turvey-Collins from Plenary Council on the process of Phase One: Listening and Dialogue. Many of you were involved in the process of 'listening to what the Spirit is saying' survey and the final report for Phase One: Listening and Dialogue is now complete and is available at <u>https://plenarycouncil.catholic.org.au/resources/reports/</u>.

On Tuesday, I was fortunate to join Russell at the Catholic Primary Principals Association Conference in Joondalup for a Professional Development Opportunity with Tracey Tokuhama-Espinosa. Tracey is the author of eight books on mind, brain, and education science, and conducts educational research with Harvard Extension School. She led us through facts and myths about the learning brain. In the coming weeks, we will be passing these facts and myths on to teachers to help develop their understanding on brain development in children.

#### Whole School Mass

The Feast of St Mary of the Cross is on Thursday 8 August. We will be having a whole school mass in the church, led by our Year 4 students, beginning at 9.00am. All parents and families are invited to attend.

#### The Bishops' Religious Literacy Assessment (BRLA)

Our Year 3 and Year 5 students will be involved in The Bishops' Religious Literacy Assessment (BRLA) next week on Thursday 8 August and Friday 9 August. This standardised assessment consists of a series of Religious Education (RE) tests developed by the Office of Catholic Education Western Australia (CEWA) that students in Years 3, 5 and 9 participate in from Catholic schools across Western Australia. The purpose of the BRLA is to measure student learning of the content in the RE curriculum. The BRLA provides a 'point in time' snapshot of student performance in RE across threeyear levels. Students' knowledge and understanding of the content of the RE curriculum is assess using a combination of multiple choice, short and extended test items. Students' faith is not assessed. The use of the BRLA complements the school-based assessment programs in RE.

#### **Catholic Identity**

This term we are focusing on the value of **RESPECT** and fundraising for Catholic Missions. To raise money for this charity, we will be holding a school-based 'Colour Run' on our school oval on Friday 30 August from 2.00pm. This will coincide with our celebration for Father's Day. We are inviting our Dads to join us in the Colour Run with a sausage-sizzle sundowner to follow.
