



Greenbatch Recycling Project

St Thomas More has joined with other local community businesses and organisations to recycle plastics which are turned into filament for 3D printers.

Greenbatch accepts milk bottles, shampoo bottles, lids (although our local Precious Plastics takes lids), plastic items marked 1 or 2 and obviously the usual water bottles.

Greenbatch has recently negotiated the back-loading of plastic with Woolworths and plastics are able to be dropped off at Woolworths on any Wednesday for shipment out to Perth the following Thursday. This is a trial project at present. We encourage all our families to support this recycling opportunity.
