Over the weekend, the Catholic Church also celebrated Pentecost. This special day commemorates when the Holy Spirit came down on the Apostles and enabled them to spread the Gospel to all nations. It is effectively the birthday of the Church, as Peter, the first Pope, converted thousands of new believers, becoming the first Catholics.

Welcome Back

Following the announcement by Premier Mark McGowan last week that we will be moving into Phase 3 of the WA Roadmap from 6 June, parents will once again be able to enter school grounds to drop off and pick up their children. However, please do not come onto the school grounds if you are feeling unwell. We thank parents for being patient and understanding during this time and hope that this new lifted restriction will assist in morning routines. Parents are encouraged not to remain in the school grounds and the social distance rule is still in place, which means at this stage, we still cannot have parents in the classrooms. We will continue to have staff meet children in the car line, particularly for the Kindy and Pre-Primary students, to assist families and further develop the independence of the children in their morning routines.

Morning routines are extremely important for children, as it assists them to hear instructions for the day, get organised and settle into class for learning. Students coming 5-10 minutes late each morning are put on the backfoot, as they have not had the time to get organised and set themselves up for their learning for the day. We understand that this is difficult for some children who are on busses and we will continue to support and assist these children as best we can. It would be appreciated if parents can ensure their children are ready to learn before the bell goes each day at 8:40am.

Semester 1 Reports

As the teachers begin to prepare for the end of Semester One reports for the students, I would like to make parents aware that for this semester, the reports will look a little different. For each learning area, the students will be graded against a 3-point scale – Above Standard, At Standard or Working Towards Standard. Attitude and effort for each of these areas will also be commented on. There will be information provided about the Personal and Social development of the children and a General Comment. Please feel free to schedule an interview with your child's teacher should you require further information about their progress or if you have any concerns.

3-Year-Old Kindy

We are beginning to gain some interest in our 3 -Year-Old-Kindy for both this year and next year. In order to attend this program, the child must have turned 3. This year, the 3-Year-Old-Kindy will operate on a Friday in Term 4 to prepare the children for Kindy in 2021.

Next year, we will offer the 3-Year-Old program on a Thursday each week. If you, or someone you know would be interested in attending this program, please contact the school.

Kindy Enrolments for 2021

I am currently taking enrolments for Kindy for 2021. Places are beginning to fill and as we are limited to 20 places, I would hate to have families miss out. If you, or someone you know, has a child who will turn 4 by 30 June 2021, please either contact the office for an enrolment form or visit our website to download the forms and return them to the school.

School Fees

Next week, school fee statements will be sent home. As we have moved to a new Finance system, these statements will look different to previous ones. I encourage those families who are experiencing financial difficulties to make contact with us so we can discuss arrangements moving forward. If you need help in understanding your statement, please contact Karien in the office.

Student Free Day

On Monday 15th June, there will be a Student Free Day, as the staff undertake some professional development. Please ensure arrangements are made for the care of your children, as the school will be closed on this day.



Helpful Hints, Tips and Reminders

Whilst students are at school, iPads are controlled by our remote management system Jamf (formely known as ZuluDesk). Educational app purchases are acquired from Apple using our VPP licence. VPP stands for Volume Purchasing Programme for Education. The educational apps that the school purchases are then remotely pushed out to student's iPads. Teachers then monitor student iPad use via the Apple Classroom app, where they control what apps or websites students can utilise in the classroom.

These helpful hints, tips and reminders for technology use will feature each week in our newsletter. If you have any questions or require any assistance with your child's iPad, please do not
