


Remembrance Day

Dear Parents and Caregivers,

I was sent a beautiful commemorative prayer booklet from the Sisters of Saint Joseph of the Sacred Heart that I would like to share with you each week.

Day One: Take on fresh Courage with Joy

We remember Mary MacKillop born on 15 January 1842 and ask her to pray with us.

Scripture:

"Then little children were brought to Jesus in order that he might lay his hands on them and pray. The disciples spoke sternly to those who brought them; but Jesus said: 'Let the little children come to me, and do not stop them; for it is to such as these that the kingdom of heaven belongs." (Matthew 19:14)

Reflection:

Alexander and Flora MacKillop were young parents and new immigrants when their first child Mary was born. After a few years living comfortably, the family lost their money and thereafter struggled to stay together. The extended family helped them out. As the eldest child, Mary would have been aware of the stress and particularly the effort her mother made to give her children a loving home.

PAUSE

What is resonating with me in this story of Mary? In what ways do I experience joy in family life?

Prayer:

God, source of life, be with all parents in the joy and the struggles of pregnancy and birth. Comfort and sustain those whose hopes for a live birth are dashed. Encourage us as a community to celebrate the children in our midst, support families in bringing up their children in love and press the government to safeguard the well being of all children and their families.
