#### **Assistant Principal News**

Dear Parents and Caregivers,

The following reflection is from a commemorative prayer booklet from the Sisters of Saint Joseph of the Sacred Heart:

#### Day Two: Take on fresh Courage with Empowering Love

We remember Mary MacKillop receiving her teaching qualifications in 1863 and we ask her to pray with us today.

#### Scripture:

But those who are waiting for God will have new strength; they will get wings like eagles; running, they will not be tired, and walking, they will have no weariness (Isaiah 40:31)

#### Reflection:

Mary MacKillop understood the value and influence of education at an early age. Home-schooled by her well-educated father in her early years, she showed his keen intellect and accurate memory. She was challenged by the discrimination. displacement and poverty experienced by her family and the circle of migrants surrounding them from the Scottish Highlands. She learnt that in the Australia of her time, the only pathway out of poverty was education. Armed with a fierce respect for others' dignity, a heart of solidarity and empathy, and with education as her tool, she set about empowering people in greatest need. She urged her Sisters to "never admit grades of distinction." Her faith in God compelled and energised her to lift others up. Through her encouragement and education, she helped them find wings to pursue their dreams and feet to run courageously towards their life goals.

Bless us with tenacious hearts, wings to lift others up, feet of untiring service and a love that does not arow wearv of doing good.

What is resonating with me in this story of Mary? How have I experienced empowerment in my life? What have I done to increase another person's power?

#### Prayer:

Holy Spirit working among us fill us with gratitude for education and with appreciation of those in the teaching ministry who empower our communities.

Calm us in this time of pandemic to be supportive of children, young people and teachers negotiating the new realities of this time.

Strengthen the commitment of governments churches and institutions to the goal of universal education in our world. Encourage us to take advantage of opportunities for learning through all our lives.




