

#### **Holy Week Celebrations**

#### Stations of the Cross

Since the earliest centuries of the Church, Christians have made pilgrimages to Jerusalem in order to retrace the steps of Jesus during his suffering and death. Around the fifteenth century, Christians began the practice of prayerfully meditating on the Passion of Christ by reproducing a miniature version of that journey, in what eventually became known as the Stations of the Cross. Yesterday, the Year Sixes did a wonderful job of leading our school through the Stations of the Cross.



#### Whole School Easter Mass

Thank you to Mrs Teague and the Year 5 class for preparing and hosting the Holy Thursday Mass this morning. During his Homily, Fr. Mat washed the feet of 12 students on the altar, just as Jesus did to his Disciples at the Last Supper. After Jesus shared this special meal before he died, he took off his everyday robe and put a large towel around himself to look like a servant. After that, he poured water into a large bowl and began to wash and then dry the disciples' feet. First of all, Jesus is like a King - but even greater than a King: He is the King of Kings! By washing the disciples' feet, he was doing something only a servant would do. This would be like if someone famous came to your house and started to clean your room!

#### **Good Friday**

In my many years teaching in Catholic schools, I'm often asked by students, "Why is it called Good Friday, if Jesus dies?" I like to try and explain Good Friday in a context that relates to our lives now.



- 1. Forgiving others: God gave all our sins to Jesus on this day, His only son, so our sins would be forgiven forever. Good Friday is a day to remember how powerful forgiving others is...a friend or anyone who has wronged you.
- 2. Finding comfort and security in our beliefs. There were a lot of people who didn't believe Jesus was the Son of God, that's why they crucified him. Good Friday is a time for us to remember that our beliefs may be challenged and tested, just like they were back then.
- 3. The power of being thoughtful. It's good for kids to have some quiet reflective time on Good Friday, to learn that Good Friday is meant to be a sombre time. Consider attending a Good Friday Mass to show children the contrast in mood against the celebration of Easter.

#### **Easter Sunday**

Celebrate! Easter Sunday is considered the most important and sacred Sunday of the entire year. It marks the anniversary of Jesus' death and resurrection and ascension into heaven.
