Sending best wishes to the Year 3 and Year 5 students who have taken part in the NAPLAN testing this week. Whilst the National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) test is a great way to see our student's progress in literacy and numeracy, it does not show all the things that make our students exceptional and uniquely incredible. So, students do your best on the tests but remember that we see all the amazingly different and individual things that you do every day to brighten up our school.

#### CatholicCare

## Sacrament of Confirmation

The Sacrament of Confirmation will be celebrated at a special ceremony in our church on **Sunday 20 June at 10.00am**, officiated by Bishop Gerard Holohan. Confirmation is one of seven Holy Sacraments. During the Confirmation ceremony, the Bishop will anoint the forehead of the nominees with the sacred oil of chrism and with the laying of the hands, the candidates will be asked to go out into the world, just as the Apostles did, with the Holy Spirit in their hearts.

#### Margaret River Readers and Writers Festival

Next Wednesday 19 May, we will welcome author Rebecca Higgie to our school, who will speak to our students as part of the Margaret River Young Readers and Writers Festival. Rebecca is an award-winning writer from Perth, Western Australia.

According to her website, "Her whole life has been spent in the company of books, with careers in libraries and universities. Formerly an academic at Curtin University and Brunel University London, she has published research on satire and politics.

She has worked in the stacks of the State Library of Western Australia and fostered childhood literacy as the Library Officer at Guildford Primary, WA's oldest public school.

She is currently the host of the Fremantle Press Podcast, where she interviews local Western Australian authors and industry experts on all things books and publishing.



Her creative work combines whimsy and play with extensive research and critical insights. Her stories and poems have appeared in publications such as *Westerly*, *Stories of Perth* and *Visible Ink*. Her novel *The History of Mischief* won the 2019 Fogarty Literary Award for an unpublished manuscript.

When she isn't writing, she is chasing around her one-year-old son Tewodros, who is by far the biggest mischief-maker of them all. She loves reading, dancing, walking in shadowy green places, and making carrot cake. You will never find a better carrot cake baker." 


