SWIMMING LESSONS

- All items of clothing, including towel have your child's name clearly marked.
- Children are to bring a waterproof pair of shoes (e.g. thongs) to school that can be worn to the Recreation Centre so their uniform, sports shoes and socks remain dry at school.
- Students can wear their sport uniform to school each day if they choose to.
- Children are to wear bathers under their uniform and bring a change of underwear in a plastic bag for after their lesson.
- The use of swimming goggles is encouraged.
- All students are ambassadors of our school, so the highest standard of behaviour and manners is expected.
- Pre-Primary and Year 2 students depart school for their lesson at 8.50am sharp. Students must be at school on time. If students arrive late, it is the parent's responsibility to escort them to the pool.
- It is advised on swimming days to ensure that your child has a hearty breakfast to ensure they have enough energy to last them the day.






