This morning, along with the Year 3, 4 and 6 classes, I listened to the Year 5 students present their Leadership speeches today. I was extremely impressed with the time and effort these students put into sharing why they think they would make a great leader in our school next year and congratulate them on putting themselves forward for these roles. I look forward to meeting with the Year 5 students individually and discussing why they feel they would be a good leader in our school next year. 2022 Leaders will be announced at our Year 6 Graduation and School Awards night on 9 December.

#### **Annual Community Meeting**

Thank you to all the parents and staff who came along to our ACM last night. It was great to see so many come and support our school and hear about all the wonderful things that have happened over the past year and what is planned for the future. I would like to thank our School Advisory Council for their support and in always so carefully reflecting on what is best for our school in the decisions that are made. A special thanks also to Fiona Guise and Nicolle Achmad for all their work in ensuring the Sundowner was set up and well catered for.

I will include a reduced version of my Principal's report that was presented last night:

We welcomed 15 new families at the start of the year into our Tommy More community, with another 10 joining us over the course of the year. It has been truly wonderful to see the way our small community has continued to grow to become such an excellent school of choice in the Margaret River region.

Through the goals specified our School Improvement Plan and Strategic Plan, we continue to move forward positively and take our school in a direction that allows each child to develop and grow. There has been a focus on further developing our Catholic Identity, with a new school prayer written, students leading the school community in Whole School Masses and celebrating important events, such as St Thomas More Feast Day, Holy Week and Advent. I believe the relationship with the Parish has continued to grow, with Fr Mat truly becoming part of our community and a real sense of school and parish working together for the benefit of all and I would like to thank Fr Mat for all his work in assisting to develop the faith and understanding of our students. Our Year 3, 4 and 6 students attended retreats at Lumen Christi church in Augusta, as part of their preparation in learning about the Sacraments of Reconciliation, Holy Communion and Confirmation, with a total of 32 of our students receiving a Sacrament over the course of the year.

St Thomas More continues to offer a range of opportunities to develop our students not only academically, but also spiritually, emotionally and physically. There has been a strong focus on developing wellbeing, not only for our students, but also our staff. While we try to implement opportunities of our students to develop their own sense of wellbeing each day – through meditations, prayer, healthy eating, movement and connection – we also made this a highlight with our Wellness Week. This week really promoted the opportunities for wellness with many community members sharing their knowledge with the students as to how to better connect with others and themselves. We were able to have the likes of doctors, experts and community members lead the school community in developing practices that will hopefully stay with each of the children throughout their lives. We were able to offer our Year 3-6 students the opportunity to participate in our Clubs program, which included the chance to learn to surf, skateboard, mountain bike, cook or crochet, just to name a few. Our support programs continue to operate under the leadership of Mrs Nicolle Achmad, with both a Gifted and Talented program operating, alongside a remedial program called Macqlit.

Our students were given the opportunity to represent their school at a number of functions, including our Year 6 leaders at a Leadership day in Bunbury, the Shire's Youth Summit, Destination High School and both ANZAC Day and Remembrance Day ceremonies. They also competed against other schools in a variety of Interschool competitions, including Athletics, Football, Netball, Cross Country and Tennis. We will also be having students represent St Thomas More in a Debating competition next week.

Our pedagogy continues to develop in the classrooms with the introduction of a K-2 phonics program called Letters and Sounds, a Year 3-6 Spelling program called Soundwaves and staff development in the use of technology in the classroom, Mathematics, Religious Education and Literacy. Both the Year 5 and 6 camps provided an opportunity for these students to develop a new range of skills and experiences.

A Peer Support program was introduced this year, where our Year 6 students led students to develop skills of resilience, developing friendships and having a positive self-image. Our 3 Year Old Kindy has continued to grow and the Before and After school care service, operated by Bluebird, has also proven to be successful.

A maintenance program was implemented to ensure our buildings remain in good condition for future years and new shade sails were installed, along with the development of an Aboriginal Sensory Garden – which is still in works to be completed and the market garden and chicken area has also continued to be developed.

Along with Nicolle Achmad, our Assistant Principal, I look forward to continuing to develop our school into the future. I believe we have one of the best school communities and I will continue to work to support and develop this in the best interests of our children. Our amazing team of teaching staff work tirelessly to ensure all children in their classrooms get the best education possible, and I know through their dedication, they aim to provide an education that is tailored to each individual student.


