Dear Parents and Caregivers,

After a wonderful first week, with the students making new friends and being in their new classes, it has been fantastic to see the way they have settled and gotten on with the important job of learning. We welcomed our new group of 3 Year Old Kindy students and those new families into our school community. We got used to wearing masks inside the classrooms and checking in when we came onto the school grounds.

Unfortunately, the goalposts have shifted again, with information being provided to schools from the Minister for Education, the Hon. Sue Ellery regarding protocols at schools. Parents are no longer able to come into the classrooms or gather at the school and should only attend the school office in the event of a significant pastoral or welfare issue related to their child. Parents will be permitted on school sites for dropoff and pick-up in outdoor locations only. This means we will not be having assemblies or parent meetings. Our first P&F meeting, scheduled for next Tuesday will be shifted off-site. More information about this will be sent home once we have secured a venue. Our Beginning of School Year Mass, scheduled for next Wednesday has also been cancelled.

I appreciate your support and understanding during this time. We acknowledge that it is not ideal and will do our best to work with families to support your children when at school.

Swimming Lessons

Due to the closure of the pool in the coming months, Swimming Lessons will commence for students in Pre-Primary to Year 6 next Monday. Students are asked to wear their bathers under their school uniform each day. Students are not permitted to come to school in thongs – please ensure the children continue to wear correct footwear when they are at school. They may bring thongs or sandals to change into before they walk over to the Rec Centre for their lesson. Please ensure your child's name is on all items. 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Student Medication

If your child requires medication to be taken during school hours, it is important that you complete an 'Student Medication Request/Record' form which is available from the office.

- Medication is to be delivered to the School Office by the parent/guardian in its original pharmacy labelled container. Please be aware that parents are responsible for delivering prescribed medications to the school.
- The label on the original medication or a special letter outlining medication from the doctor must clearly state: (i) the name of the child (ii) the dosage and times required.
- All medications are stored either in the school office/medical room or in a locked cabinet in the classroom, except where either refrigeration is required (e.g. antibiotics) or in the case of self-administered asthma reliever medication.
- Asthma medication (reliever puffers only) may be kept by a child for self-administration, only when parents/ guardians have notified the school and given permission via the Student Medication Request/Record form.
- It is the parent's responsibility to collect any 'out of date' medication for safe disposal. It is also a parent's responsibility to collect any unused medication at the completion of treatment.
- Parents/guardians must notify the School Office and complete a new Student Medication Request/Record form if there are any changes to details such as dosage or type of medication

School Fees

School fees were sent home last week and we ask families to complete the form that was attached indicating how fees will be paid over the year, which will assist with our budgeting. We strongly encourage families to set up a direct debit, which spreads the fees out over the course of the year. Please return these forms to the office as soon as possible so Karien can set up these direct debits. We appreciate your assistance promptly paying fees.

Health Care Card Tuition Fee Discount Scheme - Time to renew your application

Parents/guardians who are responsible for the payment of school fees and hold a current means tested family Health Care Card or Pensioner Concession Card will be entitled to a discount on <u>tuition fees only</u>. The discounted tuition fee per student for 2021 will be as follows:

- \$300.00 per year for Primary students (Kindergarten - Year 6).

The discounted tuition fee does not cover additional charges such as camps, the compulsory building levy and subject levies. Eligible cards must fit the scheme's means testing requirements, e.g., PP (Parenting Payment (partnered)), FA (Family Allowance), LI (Low Income), NSA (New Start Allowance), PA (Partner Allowance), SA (Sickness Allowance), SL (Special Benefit), WA (Widow Allowance) and MAA (Mature Age Allowance). Application forms are available at the office.

Forms must be completed by Friday 18h February to gain the Tuition Fee discount.

Forms received after this date may not qualify for discount.


No concession discounts will applied without submitting your card to the office by Friday 18th February.

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2022 In-Term Swimming Lessons

Dear Parents.

Our annual swimming lessons begin in Week 3 on Monday the 14th of February and will continue through to Friday 25th of February. A timetable of lessons and details of the procedures are included below. Can you please fill in the enrolment form below and return to school by Friday 4th February. No payment is needed with the form.

Points to remember:

- All items of clothing, including towel, need to have children's name clearly marked.
- Children are to bring a waterproof pair of shoes (eg: thongs) to school that can be worn over to the Recreational Centre so their uniform, sports shoes and socks remain dry at school.
- Children may choose to wear bathers under their uniform and bring a change of underwear in their plastic bag for after their lesson.
- If your child has long hair, it should be tied back.
- No jewellery is to worn on swimming lesson day.
- The use of swimming goggles is encouraged.
- All students are ambassadors of their school and families. While attending swimming lessons, the highest standard of behaviour and manners is expected.

If students arrive late, it is the parent's responsibility to escort them over to the pool.
