Dear Parents and Caregivers,

Thank you to all the parents and caregivers who have been supportive in following the protocols put upon us about parents at school. Just a reminder to parents, at this stage, parents are not permitted in the classrooms, nor can meet face to face with teachers. I ask that if you need to discuss your child or their progress, you do so via phone, email or through an online meeting.

Parents can still come onto the school grounds to drop off/pick their children up and are asked to check in via the Service WA app, or manually in the office. Masks need to be worn if you cannot safely socially distance, even when outdoors.

Swimming Lessons

Our Swimming Lessons started this week for our Pre-Primary to Year 6 students. The instructors at the pool have commented on how wonderful our students have represented both themselves and the school in their behaviour and attention – so well done! Students must come to school in

Sacrament of Reconciliation

As Catholics, we believe that it is through the sacraments we encounter Jesus, the Living God. Baptism was the gateway to our life of faith when we encountered Jesus for the first time. When we go to Mass, Jesus is not just symbolically present, he is present in the Eucharist and the Sacrament of Reconciliation isn't just a symbolic forgiveness, we recognise times we have turned away from God's love and ask God's forgiveness to transform our lives and return to His love.

Whole School Value - COMPASSION

The Charter for Compassion is a global movement, recognised by Australian Parliament in 2010, that affirms the value for compassion and understanding in our world:

"The principle of compassion lies at the heart of all religious, ethical and spiritual traditions, calling us always to treat all others as we wish to be treated ourselves. Compassion impels us to work tirelessly to alleviate the suffering of our fellow creatures, to dethrone ourselves from the centre of our world and put another there, and to honour the inviolable sanctity of every single human being, treating everybody, without exception, with absolute justice, equity and respect. It is also necessary in both public and private life to refrain consistently and empathically from inflicting pain. To act or speak violently out of spite, chauvinism, or self-interest, to impoverish, exploit or deny basic rights to anybody, and to incite hatred by denigrating others—even our enemies—is a denial of our common humanity. We acknowledge that we have failed to live compassionately and that some have even increased the sum of human misery in the name of religion. We therefore call upon all men and women to restore compassion to the centre of morality and religion to return to the ancient principle that any interpretation of scripture that breeds violence, hatred or disdain is illegitimate to ensure that youth are given accurate and respectful information about other traditions, religions and cultures to encourage a positive appreciation of cultural and religious diversity to cultivate an informed empathy with the suffering of all human beings—even those regarded as enemies. We urgently need to make compassion a clear, luminous, and dynamic force in our polarized world. Rooted in a principled determination to transcend selfishness, compassion can break down political, dogmatic, ideological, and religious boundaries. Born of our deep interdependence, compassion is essential to human relationships and to a fulfilled humanity. It is the path to enlightenment, and indispensable to the creation of a just economy and a peaceful global community."

Important Dates

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Health Care Card Tuition Fee Discount Scheme - Time to renew your application

Parents/guardians who are responsible for the payment of school fees and hold a current means tested family Health Care Card or Pensioner Concession Card will be entitled to a discount on tuition fees only. The discounted tuition fee per student for 2021 will be as follows:

- \$300.00 per year for Primary students (Kindergarten - Year 6).

The discounted tuition fee does not cover additional charges such as camps, the compulsory building levy and subject levies. Eligible cards must fit the scheme's means testing requirements, e.g., PP (Parenting Payment (partnered)), FA (Family Allowance), LI (Low Income), NSA (New Start Allowance), PA (Partner Allowance), SA (Sickness Allowance), SL (Special Benefit), WA (Widow Allowance) and MAA (Mature Age Allowance). Application forms are available at the office.

Forms must be completed by tomorrow Friday 18h February to gain the Tuition Fee discount.

Forms received after this date may not qualify for discount.






A reminder to parents that there is a simple way to let us know your child is absent from school, while providing a note at the same time. Jump on our app or website!
