Dear Parents and Caregivers,

#### **Covid and Mask Wearing Update**

Thank you to those parents who have been abiding by the protocols for schools around parents being on site, wearing masks and not being able to come into the classrooms. I understand that this can be difficult, particularly when dealing with pastoral issues relating to your child, so I appreciate your support with this. Unfortunately, as case loads increase, it will become more than likely that students from Year 3 and above will be mandated to wear a mask inside the classrooms, the same as high school students currently do. This is purely to reduce the possibility of children having to quarantine as a close contact should someone in the class test positive. The definition of a close contact is:

- Face-to-face contact for 15 minutes or longer with an infectious person where a mask was not worn;
- Interaction for more than two hours in a classroom environment where masks have not been worn or have been removed.

So, by wearing a mask, this eliminates the possibility of being a close contact. I would encourage parents and children to have a conversation around wearing a mask at school, so they are prepared when it will become compulsory. Teachers will also be discussing this with classes in Years 3 and above and looking at perhaps having a trial day/sessions. Obviously, at this point, masks are not compulsory, and we certainly wouldn't be forcing any child to wear one, but it might be a good opportunity for a practice.





#### **Wastewise School**

Yesterday, Mrs Wolf, Mrs Cummins and some dedicated students conducted a 'bin audit'. We are trying to improve our sustainability practices throughout the school, and this bin audit allowed us to see just how much waste we are sending to landfill and if we can change our practices to become more sustainable. All classes now have a recycling bin in their classrooms, and we are looking to become more sustainable with our waste. The Year 6 Environmental Committee is also assisting with this.

#### **Ash Wednesday**

Next Wednesday marks the beginning of Lent with the celebration of Ash Wednesday. Unfortunately, due to restrictions placed upon school gatherings, we will be unable to celebrate this important occasion with a Whole School Mass and receive the ashes, however, classes will individually celebrate this in their rooms and Fr Mat will visit to talk about the importance of Lent and distribute Ashes to those wishing to receive them. I encourage families to discuss what Lent means at home and why it is so important in helping us to remember to try and be better and do better, particularly caring about others around us.

#### **Assistant Principal News**

Dear Parents and Caregivers,

The Catholic Church marks the beginning of Lent next Wednesday 2 March on Ash Wednesday. Ash Wednesday begins our forty-day season of Lent that leads to Easter. Like the people of the Old Testament, when the people strayed from God's Law, people called prophets called them to repent, to turn away from their sin, and to have a change of heart.

Jesus also teaches us about the importance of **prayer**. Jesus prays many times in the Gospels; he prays during critical events in his life, and he prays before ministering to people in need.

During Lent, we are also encouraged to **fast** or give up something during this time. By fasting we make a sacrifice: the thing we choose to give up might be something we really like, like chocolate or looking at social media too much. 


