Covid Update


At this stage, there have been no members of our community (that I am aware of), who have tested positive to Covid -19, which has allowed us to continue with relative normality in delivering our educational programs to the children enrolled here. This has allowed your children to remain unaffected in receiving the high-quality face-to-face education we provide. Thank you to parents for their support in sending children to school, in Years 3 -6 with a face mask each day, as mandated by the Minister for Education and WA Health. We do have spare masks available should your child forget. As rules continue to change on a daily basis, should you or someone in your family either test positive to Covid-19 or be identified as a close contact, and you are unsure as to what to do, please do not hesitate to contact us for further advice. A Note from the Community School Health Nurse

Welcome to the new school year

Hello. I'd like to introduce myself and my role. My name is Chey Peters and I am the Community School Health Nurse for your school this year. School Health Nurses work with schools to promote healthy development and physical and emotional wellbeing. We are a good contact point for children and their families, providing information, assessments, health counselling, parenting support and referrals as needed. Our service is free and confidential.

I am part of the Healthy Country Kids Child Development Team, alongside other School Health Nurses and Allied Health professionals, such as Speech Therapists, Occupational Therapists, Physiotherapists, Dietitian, Social Worker and an Enuresis Nurse.

In response to increasing cases of COVID-19 in WA communities, our services to schools will very likely be disrupted in 2022 and will be delivered according to priorities, and in negotiation with School and Health leaders.

Caritas Second Week of Lent

AUSTRALIA (school week beginning Monday 29th February)



This week through Project Compassion we learn about 39-year-old Margret, a teacher at a vocational school for deaf students in the Solomon Islands. She was born deaf, so she knows the challenges it poses to education and employment. Apart from the difficulties the students all have, the school also faced water shortages, with not enough to supply staff and students with safe water for drinking, cooking, washing and growing vegetables.

Then Tropical Cyclone Harold damaged the school and its vegetable garden, amidst the threat of COVID-19. Staff and students rely on the vegetable garden to provide food for their meals.

With Caritas Australia's support, the school installed water tanks, provided cyclone-proof building materials and helped to implement COVID-19 prevention measures. Margret's school now has enough water for its students and the capacity to cater for more, with plans to boost food security, through increased

agricultural production.

 Around 60% of people in rural areas in the Solomon Islands don't have access to piped water, while about 80% don't have access to latrines or toilets. (<u>UNICEF</u>, 2019)




The School Canteen is open on Fridays at Lunchtimes selling lcy Poles. All items are \$1.00
