Recycling Incursion



On Wednesday, our Kindy and Pre Primary students participated in an Incursion called *Patti the Pig: It's Not All Rubbish*, which taught the children about the 'Three Bin system' and encouraged children to recycle and help in looking after our environment. This fits well with the work our Year 6 Environmental committee is doing, trying to encourage less waste going into landfill and becoming a WasteWise school.

This week through Project Compassion we learn about Biru who lives in a rural village in India's east. He lost mobility in one of his legs, after contracting polio as a child. Biru worked as a shepherd, looking after other people's cattle, to support his wife and four daughters. Keeping up with the cattle was a challenge.

Biru taught himself how to repair bicycles by watching other people, but he never dreamed of using those skills to start his own business. With your generous support, Biru was able to access an entrepreneurship and livelihoods training program, run by Caritas Australia's partner, Caritas India. He gained the support and skills he needed to start his own bicycle repair business. Now, Biru earns enough money to support his family.



We have been raising money this term for Caritas Australia with our weekly 'Hump Day Cheesies', our Cake Stall and our Easter Egg guessing competitions. We have so far raised \$400. With only two weeks to go, we aim to donate \$500 to Caritas Australia by the end of the term. Thank you to our Year 6 student leaders for establishing these fundraising initiatives and to our parents/quardians for your generous support of these projects.

Easter Egg Raffle



We are looking forward to a great day.




