

- someone who has had close interaction with a person with COVID-19 during their infectious period, where they spent more than 4 hours with them in a single

Schools are no longer considered close contact venues. A child who attends class with a peer or staff member who later tests positive to COVID-19 will no longer be identified as a close contact.

Any child who becomes symptomatic should stay home and be tested for COVID-19. Please continue to refer to healthywa.wa.gov.au for information on close contact definitions, testing and isolation requirements.

Any positive COVID-19 result should be reported on the school's COVID-19 Self-Reporting Portal

(https://cewa-collections.powerappsportals.com/COVID-19-Self-Reporting-Form/)

and positive COVID-19 RAT results must also be reported on the WA Health RAT Register, as required by the WA Government.

The easing of restrictions has meant a lot of our school activities can resume this term, including assemblies, carnivals, Masses and parent meetings.

Uniform

A reminder that students need to be dressed in the correct Winter uniform as of next week as our grace period is ending and Uniform Infringement notices will be sent home should your child come to school in the incorrect uniform next week. Please complete a uniform order form if you need to purchase any items. This Uniform order form can be sent home with your child or downloaded from our website. Items can be sent home with your child or be ready in the office to be picked up.

NAPLAN

Our Year 3 and 5 students will be participating in the 2022 National Assessment Program in Literacy and Numeracy beginning on Tuesday with the Writing assessment to be completed first. I would like to reiterate with parents that this is not a test that students need to become anxious or worried about and is only assessing one thing on one day. It does not give us information about how well some of our students can surf, sing or dance. How kind, generous or thoughtful our students are or their knowledge about the arts, sport or science. We will of course still look at the data we get from this assessment and particularly the progress our students have made since Year 3 and use it to inform our future planning.

Kindy Enrolments For 2023

I am currently taking enrolments for both 3 Year Old and Kindy for 2023. Places are beginning to fill and as we are limited in places, I would hate to have families miss out. If you, or someone you know, has a child who will turn 4 by 30 June 2022, please either contact the office for an enrolment form or visit our website to download the forms and return them to the school.

Election Update

As we move toward the Federal election on May 21, it is important to consider what the political candidates' stance is on a number of issues. One of these is education and in particular, for us, is Catholic education. St Thomas More is represented under the Federal Electorate of Forrest, which is currently held by Nola Marino. It is important our parents campaign for fairer and equitable funding for our students – because you choose to send your child to a Catholic school, should not mean your child attracts less funding than if they attended a government school. The unfortunate reality is that Catholic school students receive significantly less government funding than students in public schools. This funding is provided through infrastructure, school psychologists, management of Covid-19. I encourage you to contact our local candidates regarding these issues.




