Wellness Week

This week, the students have been participating in some sessions focusing on wellbeing. This has included spiritual, mental, physical and emotional wellbeing. On Monday, we had Kinesiologist Jess Koontz talk to the students about breathing and she utilised some sound bowls, on Tuesday Sean Allen, a local Martial Arts instructor spoke with our Year 5 and 6 students about the Rock and Water program which works with the students to develop Body Awareness, Emotional Awareness and Self Awareness. The Pre-Primary to Year 4 students also worked with Mrs Achmad to make Meditation Jars. On Wednesday, the children worked with me to create Personal Gift handprints, which will be used to create a 'Gift Tree' and will be displayed in the Library. This morning, the children also worked with Ms Knowles to do some meditation and reflection on our connection to others and to our environment. We also had a disco in the Undercover Area and the students have enjoyed participating in daily fitness, led by our Year 6 students and having daily meditations in class, using the Smiling Mind app. The winner of the healthy lunchbox competition will be announced tomorrow at our afternoon assembly. I really hope all students have enjoyed this week and have been able to take away lots of different ideas and strategies to help them in their lives.

FEAST OF ST THOMAS MORE/30TH ANNIVERSARY

Wednesday 22nd June is the Feast Day of St Thomas More, the patron saint of our Catholic School, whose values 'to live with courage' and 'always seek wisdom' we try to emulate in our daily words and actions. Thomas More was a lawyer and the son of a judge. He was convicted of treason for refusing to accept the king as the head of the Church. He went to his execution in 1535 telling spectators that he was, "the king's good servant – but God's first". He is known as the patron saint of adopted children, civil servants, politicians, and difficult marriages.

We will be celebrating St Thomas More's Feast Day tomorrow morning with a Whole School Mass at 9.00am, led by our Year 1 students. All parents are invited to attend.

On returning to school, we will acknowledge our school's 30th Anniversary by students forming the number 30 on the oval for a drone photo. We thank Silas Mountford, father of Byron in Year 2, for taking the photo for us.

After morning tea, the students will be divided into multi-age groups to participate in a variety of fun activities organised by the teachers. The students will have a sausage sizzle lunch and an icy pole, and we thank the P&F committee for organising this.

After activities are finished, there will be a whole school assembly in the undercover area at 2.30pm to commemorate our 30th Anniversary. Each student will be given a St Thomas More cross as a token of our anniversary to take home.

After school, we will continue with a celebration in the Library with parents and ex-staff members, beginning at 5.30pm. We are looking forward to a great day tomorrow.

If you wish for your child to receive either of the Sacraments, please fill in the enrolment form and return it to school or see Fr Mat for more information.


