

Assistant Principal News

Last Friday, we were fortunate to have Andrew Chinn visit our school. If students and staff smiles were not enough, I asked them for feedback, and they reported that they loved it and wish all church music was this engaging. We thank Andrew for his visit, which was vibrant, engaging and helped us connect and respond to the Gospel message.

His team at Butterfly House sent me an email this morning reminding me that it is R U OK? day today. They have written and produced a song, based on the Walk to Emmaus, a Christian perspective on R U OK? Day, called 'Walk Each Other Home' <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=egJX6yfE-W8> by Timothy Hart, which is a beautiful song to promote awareness of mental wellbeing and the importance of checking in with friends and colleagues to see if they're ok.

Here at St Thomas More Catholic Primary School, we are passionate about supporting staff and student wellbeing. Often when we're asked, "How are you?" We say we're ok but we're actually not. R U OK? Day takes the initiative to encourage attentiveness to others through authentic conversation – one that opens up the space to really be present to one another as we listen to how others are feeling and how they are coping with life. Here are four steps we can follow to start a conversation:

1. Ask R U OK?
2. Listen
3. Encourage action
4. Check-in

While RUOK day is not part of the liturgical year, the values it upholds are consistent with that of the Christian faith. As Christians we are called to be loving neighbours. We are called to be companions on the journey offering our service, understanding, compassion, support and love to the broken, lost and poor. Including those poor in spirit and mental wellbeing.

The message of RUOK day is paralleled in the story of the disciples walking to Emmaus. As the disciples were making sense of their lives, Jesus appeared to them and asked, "what has been happening for you?" He listened as they shared their story. Then Jesus offered his own words of encouragement, and after they shared a meal, the disciples were compelled to take action. And then on the day of Pentecost Jesus checked-in, so to speak, when he sent the disciples the Holy Spirit, to reassure them and encourage them to continue once again.

As communities across Australia participate in R U OK? DAY, we are reminded that every day is R U OK? DAY. We are called every day to love our neighbours back into fullness of life. And so we pray that on this day, and every day, we might be there for one another as we walk each other home.

Sacrament of Eucharist






