

I will include a reduced version of my Principal's report that was presented last night:

The year began positively with our new Nature playground being unveiled. We welcomed 15 new families at the start of the year into our Tommy More community, with another 14 joining us over the course of the year.

Through the everyday teaching across the school, the staff try to implement our school vision - to inspire life-long learners who live their faith and contribute positively to our world. This fits with our Strategic Plan and School Improvement Plan and in 2022, many of the goals in these plans came to fruition. Staff were provided with opportunities to develop their faith and knowledge. A prayer garden was further developed to provide a sacred space for children to reflect along with an Aboriginal Sensory Garden. Aboriginal perspectives were more fully embedded into the everyday teaching across the classes and staff were assisted in developing a deeper understanding and appreciation of this. Our Early Childhood team continued to assess themselves against the National Quality Standards and make improvements to ensure the children in this area continue to be enriched through their learning experiences. A Sustainability committee was established and were successful in getting a grant through the Waste Sorted Schools initiative, which has allowed further resources and sustainability practices to be embedded into our school culture.

Continued focus on continuing to develop our Catholic Identity has seen students support a number of charities over the year. The relationship with the Parish has continued to grow, with Fr Mat an important part of our community and he has helped establish a real sense of school and parish working together for the benefit of all. A total of 43 of our students received a Sacrament over the course of the year.

The students at St Thomas More have been continued to be offered a wide range of opportunities to develop not only academically, but also spiritually, emotionally and physically. A priority in focusing on wellbeing with the support of our wonderful School Chaplain has assisted our students and families develop a range of skills to cope with the many challenges that are faced on a daily basis.

We were able to offer our Year 3-6 students the opportunity to participate in our Clubs program again this term and our support programs provide a Gifted and Talented program alongside a remedial program for students requiring support. We also offered a Peer Support program and camps for both our Year 5 and 6 students.

Our students were given the opportunity to represent their school at a number of functions, including our Year 6 leaders at the Grift Leadership day in Bunbury and both ANZAC Day and Remembrance Day ceremonies. They also competed against other schools in a variety of Interschool competitions, including AFL Football, Netball, Cross Country and Tennis.

Landscaping out the front of the school has enhanced the street appeal and helped our school become more visible to the community. Andy, our Groundsman, has worked tirelessly to ensure our grounds are well maintained and he continues to further develop and improve our grounds, including work in the Market Garden, Nature Playground and play areas.

I would like to genuinely thank our amazing P&F for all their hard work and achievements this year, particularly in the installation of the Nature Play area, which has been a massive hit with the children. Through their support, the P&F were able to provide many resources and opportunities for our school and I thank this parent body for the tireless work they do, with a lot of the work often relying on the same group of people. I truly appreciate your determination to persevere for the betterment of our school and to support our children with the best resources available. A special thanks to Kathryn Locke, Liz Dawson and Bethwyn Lewis who are all stepping down from the Executive after this year.

I would also like to also thank the Catholic School Advisory Council for their continued focus on doing what is in the best interests of St Thomas More. I would especially like to thank our Catholic School Advisory Council Chair – Joel Lawrance, for his time, energy and constant vigilance in ensuring the Advisory Council is doing everything in its power to provide the best school possible. A huge thank you to Kim Maguire and Gail Warren for their work on this council, as they will both be retiring from their positions at the end of the year.

An official farewell to Michael O'Brien who will be leaving us at the end of the year. Michael has been at St Thomas More for over 25 years creating a legacy that will live on for many years to come. He is well loved by the community and will be sadly missed. He has been a leader in this school community and can be relied upon to always help out where needed. I will certainly miss Michael as he always embodies the saying of St Mary MacKillop — never see a need without doing something about it. Which is fitting, as this is where he will be off to next year, teaching High School students in the Catholic faith. Thank you Mike and we wish you all the best in your future.

Along with Nicolle and our amazing team of dedicated staff we thank you for this year and look forward to what is to come.
