Our Year 3 and 5 students will be participating in the 2023 National Assessment Program in Literacy and Numeracy beginning next Wednesday 15th March with the Writing assessment to be completed first. The remaining assessments will be completed in Week 8 from 21st March. I would like to reiterate with parents that this is not a test that students need to become anxious or worried about and is only assessing one thing on one day. It does not give us information about how well some of our students can surf, sing or dance. How kind, generous or thoughtful our students are or their knowledge about the arts, sport or science. We will of course still look at the data we get from this assessment and particularly the progress our students have made since Year 3 and use it to inform our future planning.

Clubs Program

Next Thursday, our Clubs program will kick off for our Year 3 to 6 students. This program will run between recess and lunch and allows the children to develop knowledge and skills in an area of their choice, which traditionally falls outside the curriculum. We believe it is important to develop the whole child at St Thomas More, so as a result, these children will be able to participate in activities including Surfing, Mountain Biking, Skateboarding, Cooking, Orienteering, Knitting, Dancing and Gardening. The program will run for 4 weeks. The Year 3 to 6 students are invited to wear their sport's uniform on a Thursday for these 4 weeks.

- Thursday March 23: Numeracy




Absentees



Second Week of Lent

This week through Project Compassion we learn about Laxmi.

Laxmi lives with her mother and siblings in Jajarkot, (Nepal) one of the least developed districts with almost half of the population living below the poverty line.

Tragedy struck when Laxmi was 10-years-old. Her father, who worked hard to pay for his children's education, passed away. Laxmi was devastated. She used to love to go to school but for the first time she stopped attending her classes.



Before her father's passing, Laxmi joined a child's club at her school that was run with the support of Caritas Nepal. Child's clubs support students to develop their speaking, writing and leadership skills through extracurricular activities.

Thanks to the support of her child's club, Laxmi was encouraged to resume her education. She became an active member of her child's club, where she developed the skills and confidence to become a leader, advocating for clean water taps at her school. Laxmi is now excelling in her studies and working towards her dream of becoming a civil engineer.

Since 2018, Caritas Nepal has supported more than 5,000 children through the child's clubs.
